DAY 1

Nordic Asian Venture Alliance

HEALTHTECH DELEGATION APRIL 2023

KICK OFF

Kicking-off the 1st day of the delegation program with advice on how to pitch to Japanese investors and companies:

This was followed by an introduction to sales and digitalization of the healthcare sector in Japan by local expert Klaus Jacobsen from MedTech Partners GK and a session of evaluation of medical products by Takashi Misu from the Japanese Pharmaceutical and Medical Devices Agency



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VISIT UTEC

Then off to the beautiful and iconic area of Tokyo University Campus to meet with Asia's largest deeptech fund, UTEC - The University of Tokyo Edge Capital Partners, with more than 5 funds under their belt and a total of more than 85 billion JPY AUM (~634 M USD).

NETWORKING

To end the day, off to bustling Shibuya for a networking event at Shibuya Startup Support with their cool rooftop, where they invited the local tech community partners, including KOBE Biomedical Innovation Cluster, EU-Japan Centre for Industrial Cooperation, Nordic Innovation House Tokyo











NORDIC HEALTH SUMMIT JAPAN

Greeted by the Nordic Ambassadors to Japan, the Summit kicked off with a seminar to introduce the Life Science sector in the Nordics (by Charlotte af Klercker), the excellent examples of Nordics-Japan collaboration (presented by Eisai Co., Ltd, BioArctic, Torii Pharmaceutical Co Ltd, ALK, Solasia Pharma KK, and AstraZeneca), and pitching session by our delegation.

Then came the main part of the Summit: matchmaking meetings. Meetings were scheduled beforehand, and 120+ meetings took place onsite and online in 3 hours.

To wrap up the Summit, the Swedish Ambassador to Japan welcomed us at the beautiful residence. The venue was filled with good vibes and continued discussions from the matchmaking meetings.



DAY3

VISITING MARUBENI & NOVO NORDISK





The delegation met members of Marubeni's Next Generation Business Development Division, Regional Planning & Coordination Dept. (Europe & CIS Section), and Clairvo Technologies, Inc. their subsidiary focusing on development and distribution of AI and Healthcare products, to pitch and to discuss partnership opportunities. The delegation received very high interest and made connections to have further discussions towards collaboration to penetrate the Japanese market (and even beyond to other parts of Asia).

In the afternoon, we head over for a visit to Novo Nordisk Japan HQ. Their insights on the business culture differences in the Nordics and Japan, and their examples of collaborations with Japanese partners/startups for adding value to their solutions were very informative and inspiring.



DAY 4

HOSPITAL TOUR

The group started the day by visiting Juntendo University Hospital, one of Japan's most modern hospitals facilitating the largest number of beds in Japan, famously known for their research internationally.

The delegation got the chance to pitch their solutions to and get feedback from Dr. Hiryuki Daida, professor of Radiological Technology and Cardiovascular Medicine department, followed by a tour of the hospital. Furthermore, the group was introduced to GAUID by Dr. tamaki nara, the hospital's open innovation platform. Amazing to hear about the impressive operations of the hospital and get an insight into how they work with innovation.

VISIT GETINGE JAPAN

After lunch, the group visited Getinge Japan, a Swedish medical equipment manufacturer that has been operating in Japan for over 30 years. During the visit, we could see their high-tech showcasing room displaying some of their portfolio products unique to the Japanese hospitals.

PITCHING AT LINK-J

The pitch event was hosted by Life Science Innovation Network Japan (LINK-J). Well-rehearsed pitches were outlined by the delegates to the audience coming from all corners of the Japanese life sciences ecosystem (+300 sign-ups), attending online and physically.
